DID YOU KNOW?

- It takes on average 2 million flowers and 55,000 miles of travel for bees to make one pound of honey!
- Goldenrod has started to bloom which is a wonderful site for the beekeeper, and only a
 beekeeper can be thankful for the smell of its honey! Goldenrod and aster mark the
 last nectar flow of the year in our area.

WHAT TO DO DURING SEPTEMBER

- Queens will be laying their winter bees. If you haven't tested for varroa in the last month – and treated if needed – do so as soon as possible to give the winter bees a healthy start! The OSBA threshold limit for September is 1% (3 mites per 300 bees which is about 1/2 cup of bees). Treatment options are found at https://honeybeehealthcoalition.org/varroa.
- Small hive beetles are looking for a place to reproduce, yellow jackets are happy to rob
 a honey bee colony, and wax moths are happy to move into a weak colony. Protect
 your hives as best as possible and trap, trap, trap!
- Make sure the queen has room to lay. The eggs she lays now will be the workers who
 will carry the colony through until spring. The drones, if not already, will be kicked out
 of the hive.
- Evaluate your colonies. Do a full inspection, looking at the overall health, brood patterns, food stores, and strength. Combine weak colonies that are disease free with stronger colonies. Remove queen excluders and empty supers.
