
### **Spring Beekeeping - Part 2**

I am writing this on May 3, 2022. Winter seems safely behind us with more days in the 70s and Mother's Day celebrated this Sunday. If your bees are not building up there is a problem. If you installed a new package and the queen was released, she may be under-mated. If so, best to replace her ASAP. Start with a call to the package provider and explain the problem, they may send a replacement queen at no charge.

When I started beekeeping in 2010, I was enthralled with all aspects of my new hobby. I read a lot of books and journals, watched lots of videos and asked lots of questions of more experienced beekeepers. In a previous Beezette I recommended the University of Guelph's library of excellent YouTube videos. It is a treasure trove of information with lots of factual data and helpful information. The URL above will take you to a page on "first year beekeeping". Randy Oliver has done lots of research on varroa management, and you will find several articles addressing the various pros and cons of each treatment method. It is more than the average person can read in a single session, but if you

stick with it and persevere it will be worth the effort. What I like about the site is its use of the scientific method to reach conclusions. Most of us hobbyist beekeepers don't have enough hives to conduct accurate studies, not so with Mr. Oliver. While he is located in northern California, a climate dissimilar to ours here in southwestern Ohio, lots of his practices transfer to our climate. While there are lots of issues to address in beekeeping, varroa management is among the most important, because if you do nothing and adopt a laissez-faire attitude, you will likely lose your bees after two or three years and possibly cause problems for other beekeepers.
