DID YOU KNOW?

Most scout bees have been forager bees in the original colony. Use this knowledge to help locate your swarm traps. Placement near a food source where the foragers have been frequenting may entice them to come back with their friends and their queen!

WHAT TO DO DURING APRIL

- Register your apiary location/s with the Ohio Department of Agriculture. The fee is \$5 per location regardless of the number of hives and is due by June 1, 2020. You can find a link to the registration form at https://agri.ohio.gov/wps/portal/gov/oda/divisions/plant-health/forms/plnt_4201-002. If you are trying to find it without using the link, it is found under Plant Health, Apiary Program, Registration.
- Swarms are hot and heavy this year! Many beekeepers are already at their max with no more equipment to house them. If you need bees and haven't set any out yet, swarm traps are a great way to increase your apiary.

• Spring nectar flow has already begun at the southern most aspects of our county and is working its way north. Be sure to get your supers on your established colonies.
