## **DID YOU KNOW?**

On each flight, honey bees will only forage on one species of flower. Masses of the same flower (or a flowering tree) allow their trips to be more efficient and allow them to tell the other workers where a good food supply is!

## **WHAT TO DO DURING JULY**

- Depending on where you are and your local flora, we are in or near to entering into a dearth. Monitor your hives for resources. Please be mindful of your beekeeping neighbors within a 3 mile radius when considering open feeding versus feeding internally. Some have not pulled their honey off and will do so expecting it to be actual honey.

- In a dearth, the queen might slack off on egg laying. This is the time that varroa can begin to get a foothold in our colonies. Monitor for varroa and keep the ball in your court! Looking for options on how to treat? Go to <https://honeybeehealthcoalition.org/varroa>.
- Small hive beetles love the smell of beehives as much as we do! Keep a strong colony with no more comb than bees to guard. There are a variety of traps and deterrents on the market that can be used to help them keep the pesky armored insects in check. Have you found something that works well for you? Please share it with our club. SHB are a community problem and we are in this fight together.
