She is recently the past-President of Ohio State Beekeepers (the first woman president!), where she helped develop the 4-H Program, Affiliate Program, Underserved Grant, Apiary Diagnostic Kit, Traveling Speaker Program, Newsletter, and Annual Conference, along with other support programs. She is co-founder of the non-profit LEAD for Pollinators (leadforpollinators.org), a group that was created to provide Leadership, Education, Action, Development for groups supporting pollinators.

DID YOU KNOW?

• A honey bee colony acts as a single being, but according one study from 2012, some individual honey bees appear to be novelty-seekers. I don't think we'll see the bees gearing up for a deep diving caving exhibition, but specific patterns of gene activity found in humans who are thrill-seekers are also found in these bees. Gene Robinson from the University of Illinois led the study that found that less than 5% of the honey bees in a swarm take on the task of finding their new home. These same bees apparently are about 3.4 times more likely than their colony co-workers to take the adventuresome risks in scouting for new food sources.

WHAT TO DO DURING FEBRUARY

- Starting or increasing your apiary with packages, nucs or complete hives? Get your order placed!
- Visit your apiary -
 - Check entrances and the area around them for signs of animal damage.
 - Keep entrances clear of snow, debris and dead bees so when the temps warm enough they can get out and fly.
 - Peek in to your candy boards for supply. Warm temperatures mean busier bees who will eat more.
- Build and repair woodenware.
