

WHAT TO DO FOR YOUR BEES IN FEBRUARY

- Visit your apiary!
- Check your hive entrances for any blockage, and the areas around the hives for any signs of animal damage.
- On a sunny warm upper 50"s day, when the bees are flying, you can open the hive and check food stores. Feed as needed.
- Check your equipment for repairs and cleaning (propolis chips off more easily in the cold). Build and repair woodenware.
