WHAT TO DO FOR YOUR BEES IN MARCH

- Visit your apiary!
- Check your hive entrances for any blockage, and the areas around the hives for any signs of animal damage.
- On a sunny warm upper 50"s day, when the bees are flying, you can open the hive and check food stores. *Feed the colony if low on capped honey.Feed a pollen substitute.
- *Reverse hive bodies
- *Perform the first comprehensive inspection of the season.
- *Perform seasons first check for capped brood and brood pattern
- Check your equipment for repairs and cleaning (propolis chips off more easily in the cold). Build and repair woodenware.
- Check out a new book about bees.
