Spring Beekeeping - Part 3

Due to the above average rainfall this spring, bee swarms are running a little later than normal. Preventing your bees from swarming is one of the beekeeper's main challenges. Conversely, catching a swarm is a bonus. Tom Seeley, a professor at Cornell University, has studied bees his entire life. His books, lectures and interviews are excellent.
