

CONTRIBUTING THOUGHTS FROM GEOFF HULTGREN:

Hello fellow beekeepers! I hope your bee season is going well so far. Hopefully, the honey harvest went well. Even though it is late summer, we need to be thinking of overwintering your hives. The priority now, is mite control and making sure your colonies are strong enough to over winter. Many beekeepers may decide to harvest honey from the fall nectar flow. If you decide to do this, be careful to leave enough for the bees to have over the winter. On the other hand, if you think that your bees do not have enough provisions you may need to feed them. In this part of the state, your hives should weigh anywhere from 65 – 75 pounds You can estimate this by lifting up on the back of the hive by the bottom board. There are several commercial hive scales that you may buy. You may notice that the worker bees are a little chubbier and have more hair these are winter bees. Winter bees’ main job is to keep the hive going over the winter. For mite control check out the honeybee health coalition website honeybeehealthcoalition.org Varroa Management tool. For other tips on overwintering your hives, one of my favorite sites the university of Guelph honeybee research Center’s videos these can be found at <https://hbrc.ca> .

Honey Extractor Rental

Warren County Ohio Beekeepers has a honey extractor that can be rented by members for \$5.00 per day. The Maxant 6 frame extractor is stored in a storage unit near Monroe Ohio.

To reserve the extractor go to our website www.warrencountyohiobeekeepers.org. From the menu, select Members>Reserve Honey Extractor. This page will describe the procedure for cleaning the extractor and also allow you to enter your name, email address, date you would like to pick up the extractor and number of days you will be using the extractor.

Once you complete and send the reservation form, our treasurer will verify your membership and availability of the extractor for the desired dates. If all is OK you will receive an email from the treasurer. The email will contain a link to the storage facility contact information. It also will include a password that lets the facility know that you have been approved for the extractor rental. The facility contact will provide you with a temporary gate code for the storage facility, the storage unit number and the location of the key. The extractor has a large wooden platform that should be used as it stabilizes the extractor during operation.

Please return the extractor clean and sanitized per the instructions. Once you have returned the extractor select Members>Return Extractor from the website menu. Once you complete the form on this page you will be directed to Paypal for the rental amount.
