The speaker of our next meeting will be Mr Bob Hooker on Swarm Management/splits and more.

BIO:

Bob Hooker, who began keeping honey bees in the 1970's, operates Daglow Apiary in Franklin County, Ohio. He and his wife Mary, live on a three acre homestead on the southeast side of Columbus where they have a large garden and the apiary. In addition to producing honey and other honey bee products they raise a large portion of the food they eat, practicing sustainable, organic gardening. Bob is past president of the Ohio State Beekeepers Association, the Lorain County (Ohio) Beekeepers Association, the Heartland Beekeepers Association, and the Harrison County Beekeepers Association and served on the Central Ohio Beekeeper's Association (COBA) Board of Directors. He was Harrison County Apiary Inspector for six years. He has been involved in the OSBA Traveling Speakers program since its inception. Bob retired as pastor of the First United Methodist Church of Oberlin, Ohio in 2010 after thirty seven years of pastoral ministry In the East Ohio Conference of the United Methodist Church.

Our club expert for "What To Do in the Month Ahead" will be Joe Hahn.

At the March Meeting:

Master Gardener Gary Keuffer, presented **Pollinator Gardens**. The "Gardening for Pollinators" program was presented to illustrate what you can do as a gardener to create a habitat to benefit the wide variety of pollinators that are so critical to our

ecosystem. Gary's presentation was a wealth of knowledge. He provided handouts to help us all move forward in our gardening plans to support our bees!

John Favaron was the guest expert for "What To Do in the Month Ahead". John provided a great deal of information we should be thinking of right now and in the weeks ahead in preparation for spring! John provided the notes below as a reminder.

- On warm days, 55 degrees and over, take a quick peek inside to look for food, and brood.
- Warmer Temps, 68 and above, look at brood and clean off bottom board.
- If feeding is needed use solid sugar until nights are in the 50 degrees mark.
- Use small amounts of pollen patty. Watch for larva in unconsumed patty. if found, freeze 48 hrs.
- Clean existing unused equipment. Clean propolis from frames and boxes especially the channel the frames set in and edges of frames.
- Freeze frames before use. If frames have been outside for 3 consecutive days of freezing you should be ok.
- Check exterior conditions on all unused boxes/lids/bottom boards. Sand paint/ seal! Remember a small crack can contribute to early rot.
- Assemble/ paint any new equipment to prepare for upcoming swarm/split season
- Plant some trees or flowers for you and the bees to enjoy!
