Bob is an instructor in COBA's beekeeping school and enjoys mentoring new beekeepers. He was Harrison County Apiary Inspector for six years. He was an instructor in the OSBA Traveling Speakers program for six years. Bob retired as pastor of the First United Methodist Church of Oberlin, Ohio in 2010 after thirty-seven years of pastoral ministry In the East Ohio Conference of the United Methodist Church. The title of his talk will be: "Swarms and Such, Beekeeping in March".

HONEY EXTRACTOR RENTAL

What To Do in the Month Ahead:

- The Beekeeping to-do list for March has some similarity to February duties:
 - Colonies can die in late winter / early spring from starvation. Check hives for adequate food storage and add fondant or sugar brick.
 - Sugar syrup and pollen substitute may be an option in the later part of March depending on the weather.
 - Other considerations:
 - Have you treated for Varroa mites?
 - Yikes, it's getting late! Order new bees ASAP!!
 - Last minute checks on the condition of your hive equipment.
 - Reverse the hive boxes to put the brood box down low.
 - Continue reviewing your Beek books to learn / refresh your memory.
 - First comprehensive inspection of the season. Weather permitting, you may be able to do a brief hive inspection. If you do inspect, have a clear plan on what you are looking for before you crack the lid (food, check for eggs/queen, brood pattern, bee population?) Make it quick!
 - Know what you will do to reduce risk of swarming (not applicable for first year beekeepers).

Tips, Tricks and Useful Information

Did you know that Ohio Law requires all beekeepers, regardless on how few hives you keep, are required to annually register with the Ohio Department of Agriculture? The registration form can be obtained on line. The due date for registration is June 1 of each year. The fee is just \$5.00 per <u>apiary</u>. For more information Google, *Ohio Dept of Agriculture Apiary program.*

- ✤ 5th Annual Queen Rearing and Grafting Workshop. This two-day workshop/field day will educate participants on honeybee/queen biology, grafting and queen rearing concepts, detection of mites and honeybee biting behavior traits, and finally, knowledge on Ohio inspectors and their role in inspecting bee colonies. This workshop will be divided into 2 days with the first day on classroom education, setting up a cell starter and grafting practice. The second day will consist of more classroom education, grafting and finally a test. There will be a supplementary ZOOM meeting in April (Date TBD) for those registered for the workshop to go through the basics of grafting and queen rearing. Instructors will be Hongmei Li-Byarlay and Danielle Kroh from the CSU Bee Lab. Each participate trained in person will receive a certification upon completion of class and test. The fee for registration is \$50/person, which is non-refundable after purchase, and covers lunch, the breeder gueen and the basic supplies for the workshop. There is only room for 20 participants so register early. The deadline to register is **April 18, 2024**. All workshop participants will have an opportunity at the end of May to receive a virgin breeder queen with high grooming and mite biting traits. Please use the following link to sign up.
